Handcrafted stained glass windows depicting nursery rhymes graced the St. Vincent and Sarah Fisher Center in Farmington Hills for decades. Through April, Michigan Glass Month, 10 of the surviving windows that have been lovingly restored to their original condition by local artists will be on display in The Village Theater at Cherry Hill in Canton. Starting Sunday through April 29, the exhibit is free and open to the public (except major holidays), 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Monday-Friday and during public performances at the theater, 50400 Cherry Hill Road; (734) 394-5300; canton-mi.org/villagetheater. Founded nearly 170 years ago by the Daughters of Charity, the St. Vincent and Sarah Fisher Center served southeast Michigan over the years as an orphanage and, more recently, a residential/foster care agency. Now back in Detroit, it offers tutoring, job counseling and other services to children and adults as the Education Experience, www.svsfcenter.org.
